Your Role in the Conference

The three-day event consists of around 30 short talks and 100 posters presented by young researchers. Presentations on economic and social as well as biological aspects of conservation are welcome. Prizes are awarded for outstanding talks and posters.

Workshops help build practical skills. Social events provide lots of opportunities to network with others in your own and related disciplines.

Conference Costs

The conference fee is £80 (this includes registration, carbon offset, lunches, tea and coffee, and three evening events). Accommodation with breakfast for a limited number of delegates is available in a nearby college at £39 per person per night.

Bursaries

SCCS will provide financial support for some students from developing countries and eastern Europe. Bursaries can be used to cover travel and conference expenses.

Internships

Internships are available for students from developing countries and eastern Europe to attend SCCS and then spend a month with a UK-based conservation NGO or a university department carrying out a project of mutual interest. Internship applications must be submitted by 14 October 2016.
